ITINERARY:

Day 1

We head north stopping at Moffat for a lunch stop then on through Kilmarnock to the coast and Seamill. Arriving with plenty of time to relax, maybe a walk along the beach or swim before dinner.

Day 2

We travel the pretty coast line to Culzean Castle (admission included) where we have a guided tour of this famous castle, and plenty of time to explore the attractive gardens.

Day 3

Today we start by travelling to Alloway and explore 'Brig a Doon' made famous by Robbie Burns, afterwards we have time to visit the sea side resort of Ayr, we return via Troon and Saltcoats.

Day 4

Saying goodbye to Seamill we head north crossing the River Clyde at the Eskine Bridge and then onward via Loch Lomond with great scenery all the way, we have a suitable picturesque lunch stop before arriving in Oban for the Mid afternoon crossing to The Isle of Mull, and our hotel is close to the steamer pier so we will be settled in well before dinner

Day 5

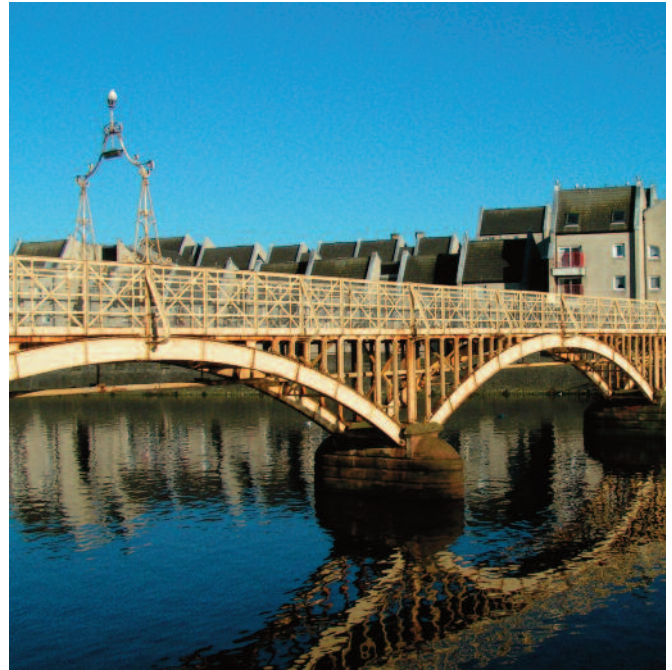
Morning drive to Tobermory, and on return to Craignure, we join the Isle of Mull Railway (of Balmory fame) For the pretty ride to Torosay Castle & gardens, admission for both is included in the holiday price.

Day 6

Today is one the highlights of the tour, we head South west to Fionnphort, here we board the ferry as foot passenger to visit one of Scotlands treasures IONA, we allow enough time to visit the world famous Abbey Also we offer you the option to travel out to Fingals Cave on The Isle Staffa with Gordon Grant, Gordon subject the weather and tides takes the boat close to the cave The cave has had many famous people visit over the years including Queen Victoria, but the man who made it famous was the Romantic composer Felix Mendelssohn visited in 1829 and wrote, Hebrides Overture Opus 26, commonly known as Fingal's Cave overture), inspired by the weird echoes in the cave Mendelssohn's overture popularized the cave as a tourist destination. **NOT TO BE MISSED** ferry crossing only included
